Ardmore, Oklahoma Pharmacist, Dorothy Gourley, Honored for Outstanding Community Service

Washington, DC – The Oklahoma Pharmacists Association (OPhA) has selected Dorothy Gourley as the recipient of the 2011 Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service. Gourley was presented with the award during the OPhA Conference & Trade Show, June 9-12, 2011. The Award is sponsored by the American Pharmacists Association Foundation and the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations.

Gourley is presently serving President of the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy and on the DUR advisory board to the Oklahoma Healthcare Authority for the Medicaid drug program. She has served as a member of the committee for the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy to review and propose revisions to the hospital pharmacy rules section and has chaired a committee to write new rules for hospital drug rooms. She has served on several boards and committees including the Advanced Practice Nurses and CRNA's, the Southwestern Pharmacy Alumni Foundation, Inc., the OU continuing education committee, the Pharmacy Alumni Association Council for Southwestern. She was selected by the Southwestern Pharmacy Alumni Association as an Outstanding Alumni and was appointed by Governor Henry to serve as a member of the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy. Gourley is a member of OSHP, ASHP, APhA and OPhA. She has served on the Legislative Committee for both OSHP and OPhA, as president of OPhA in 2003-2004 and as a Board Member of Pharmacy Providers of Oklahoma.

Established in 1958, the Bowl of Hygeia Award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take active roles in the affairs of their respective communities. The award is presented annually by participating state pharmacist associations, including those in the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In addition to service through their local, state and national pharmacy associations, award recipients have devoted their time, talent and resources to a wide variety of causes and community service.

The Bowl of Hygeia is the most widely recognized international symbol for the pharmacy profession and is considered one of the profession's most prestigious awards. The Bowl of Hygeia has been associated with the pharmacy profession since as early as 1796 when the symbol was used on a coin minted for the Parisian Society of Pharmacy. The bowl represents a medicinal potion and the snake represents healing. Healing through medicine is precisely why the pharmacy profession has adopted the Bowl of Hygeia symbol.
