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North Centerville, Utah, Pharmacist Kathy Goodfellow, Honored for Outstanding Community Service

Washington, DC – The Utah Pharmacists Association (UPhA) has selected Kathy Goodfellow as the recipient of the 2011 Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service. Goodfellow was presented with the award during the UPhA Annual CE Convention, March 31 – April 2, 2011. The Award is sponsored by the American Pharmacists Association Foundation and the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations.

Goodfellow is the owner of Mountain View Pharmacy in Bountiful, Utah. She served as President of UPhA in 2006 and on the Board from 1989 to 1992. Through her leadership, the *Pharmacy News Capsule* was created and is still going strong today. In fact, in most cases, she still serves as a final editor for the issues.

Goodfellow is a member of the Retail Advisory Board for Leader drug stores through Cardinal Distribution and has served on the Board of Directors for the Utah Cooperative of Independent Pharmacists. Her professionalism reflects her desire to unite and strengthen pharmacy throughout the state of Utah and ultimately the country.

Established in 1958, the Bowl of Hygeia Award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take active roles in the affairs of their respective communities. The award is presented annually by participating state pharmacist associations, including those in the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In addition to service through their local, state and national pharmacy associations, award recipients have devoted their time, talent and resources to a wide variety of causes and community service.

The Bowl of Hygeia is the most widely recognized international symbol for the pharmacy profession and is considered one of the profession's most prestigious awards. The Bowl of Hygeia has been associated with the pharmacy profession since as early as 1796 when the symbol was used on a coin minted for the Parisian Society of Pharmacy. The bowl represents a medicinal potion and the snake represents healing. Healing through medicine is precisely why the pharmacy profession has adopted the Bowl of Hygeia symbol.
