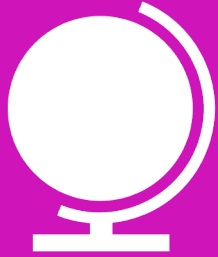
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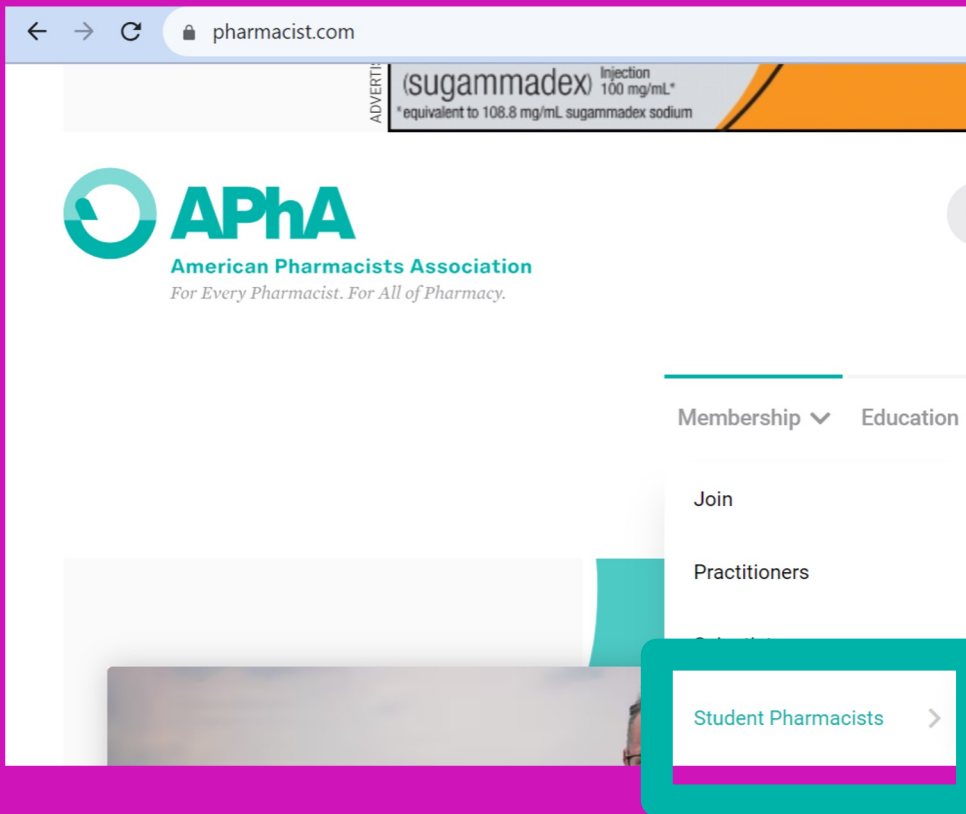

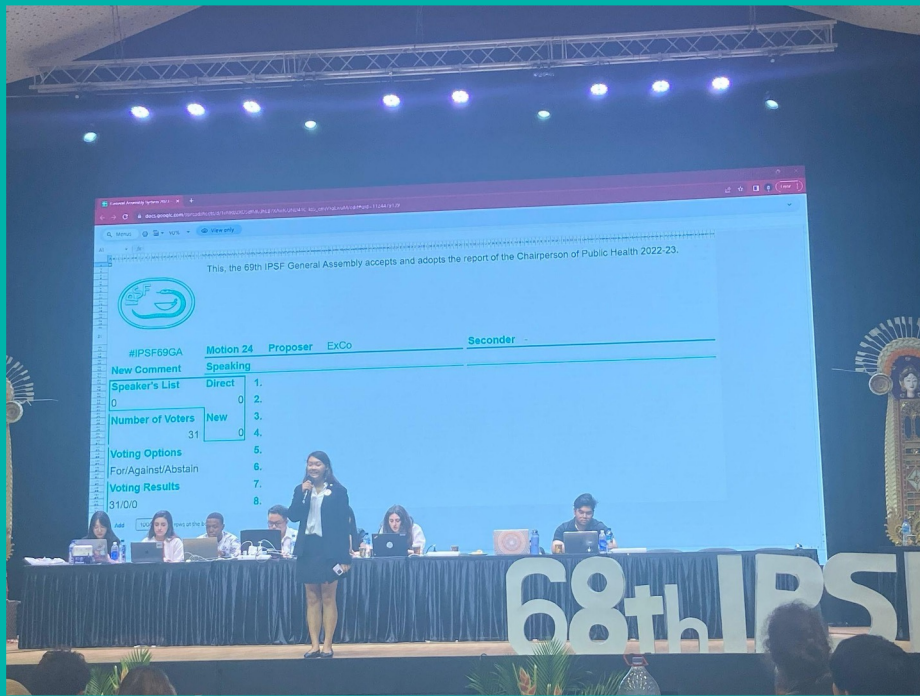

Student Exchange Program (SEP)

Share your experience with the world!

Immerse yourself in a different culture and experience the practice of pharmacy in one of more than 80 participating countries!

Duration: 2 – 8 weeks during the summer

Types of sites: community, hospital, clinical, industry, research, informatics

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SEP

Outgoing: Application form open from September 1st to November 1st; APhA-ASP can send 3 students for every 2 students hosted

Incoming: Students are matched with host sites in February/March; APhA-ASP can accept as many students as there are host sites!

- Obtain approval from chapter advisor(s) and administration
- Email APhA-ASP Student Exchange Officer (SEO) (Joanne Shen, usaipsfseo@gmail.com)
- Elect a Local Exchange Officer (LEO)
- Decide on a timeframe to host
- Find suitable accommodations
- Find willing preceptors
- Sign up to become a host site!
 - Application due January 1st

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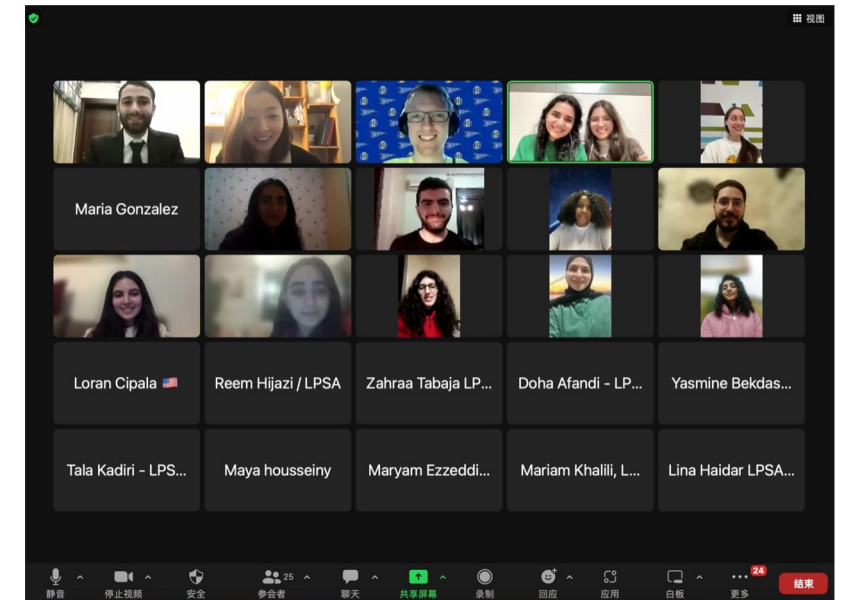

Participate in a virtual student exchange with other countries without leaving the comfort of your home. Plus, it is FREE!

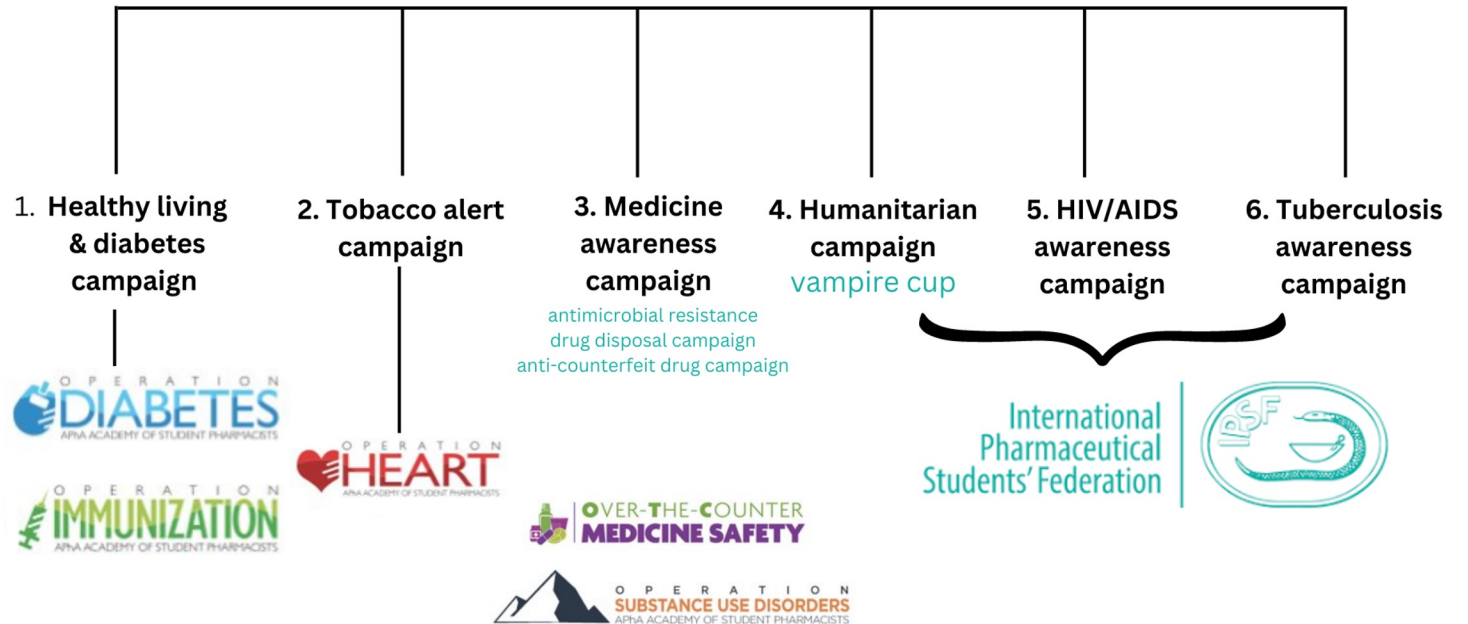
- Virtual SEP I - Fall 2023 (date TBD)


Vampire Cup

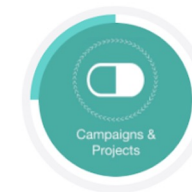
International Vice-President Toolkit

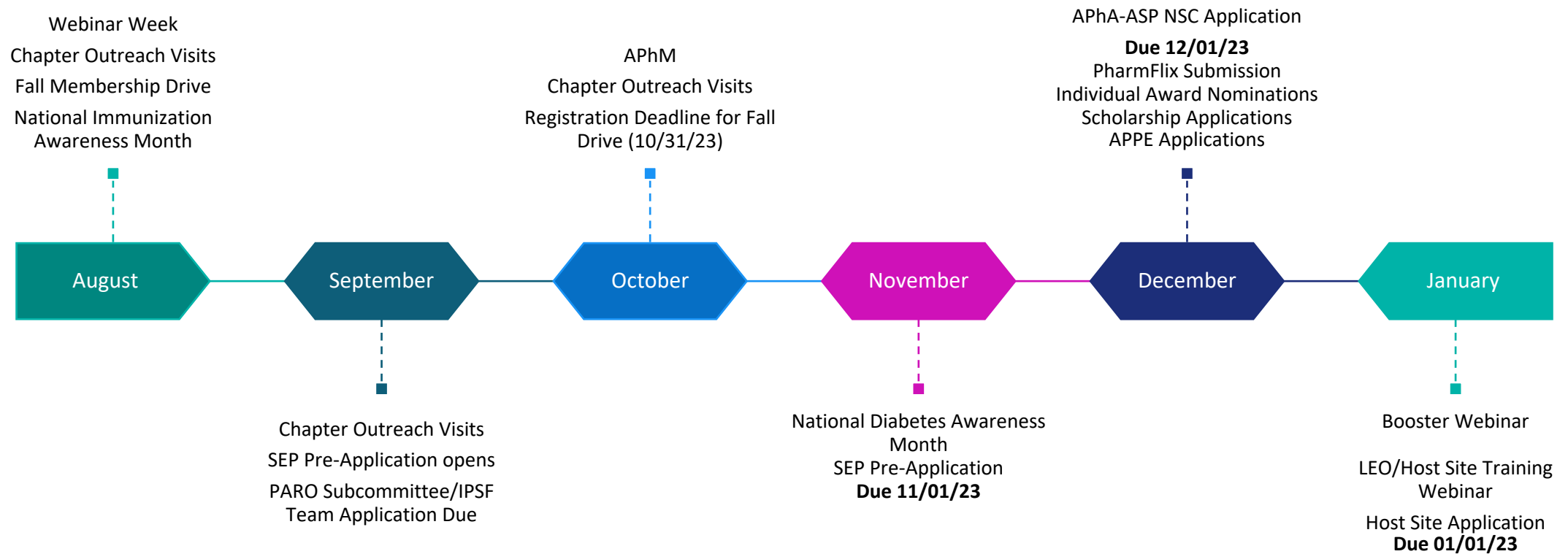
