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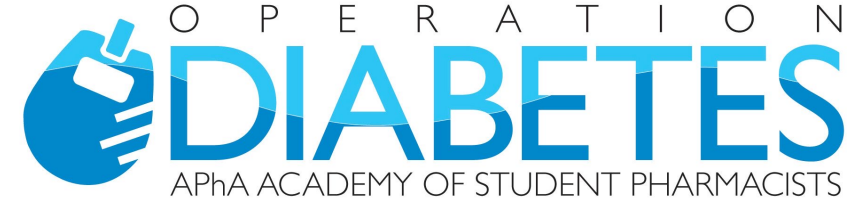

Background

- Launched in 2001
- In 2020-2021 alone:
 - **115** chapters participated
 - **6,606** student pharmacists participated
 - **486** Operation Diabetes events conducted
 - **2,045** patients screened
 - **173** patients referred to their primary care provider
 - **18,870** patients received health and wellness services
 - **3,730,561** individuals reached through public relations initiatives



- What other organizations that you can collaborate with for hosting events?
- How can I utilize my project committee to best meet the needs of the Operation, my chapter, and my community?

- Patients who are elderly (long term care facilities or nursing homes)
- Patients in rural areas
- Ethnic or racial minority populations
- Pediatric patients (elementary schools, day cares, etc)
