Background

- Launched in 2001
- In 2020-2021 alone:
 - 115 chapters participated
 - 6,606 student pharmacists participated
 - 486 Operation Diabetes events conducted
 - 2,045 patients screened
 - 173 patients referred to their primary care provider
 - 18,870 patients received health and wellness services
 - 3,730,561 individuals reached through public relations initiatives

 - c. Education and awareness on healthy lifestyles





- Patients who are elderly (long term care facilities or nursing homes)
- Patients in rural areas
- Ethnic or racial minority populations
- Pediatric patients (elementary schools, day cares, etc)
