

Through participation in Operation Heart student pharmacists work in their communities to encourage lifestyle modifications, screen for associated risk factors, and provide education about medications for heart disease and for cardiovascular risk reduction.

- 2021-2022 Stats

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- 120 chapters participated
- 9,946 student pharmacists participated
- 589 faculty and staff members participated
- 263 pharmacists participated
- 765 Operation Heart events conducted
- 827 patients referred to their primary care provider
- 43,545 patients received health and wellness services
- 2,588,052 individuals reached through public relations initiatives




