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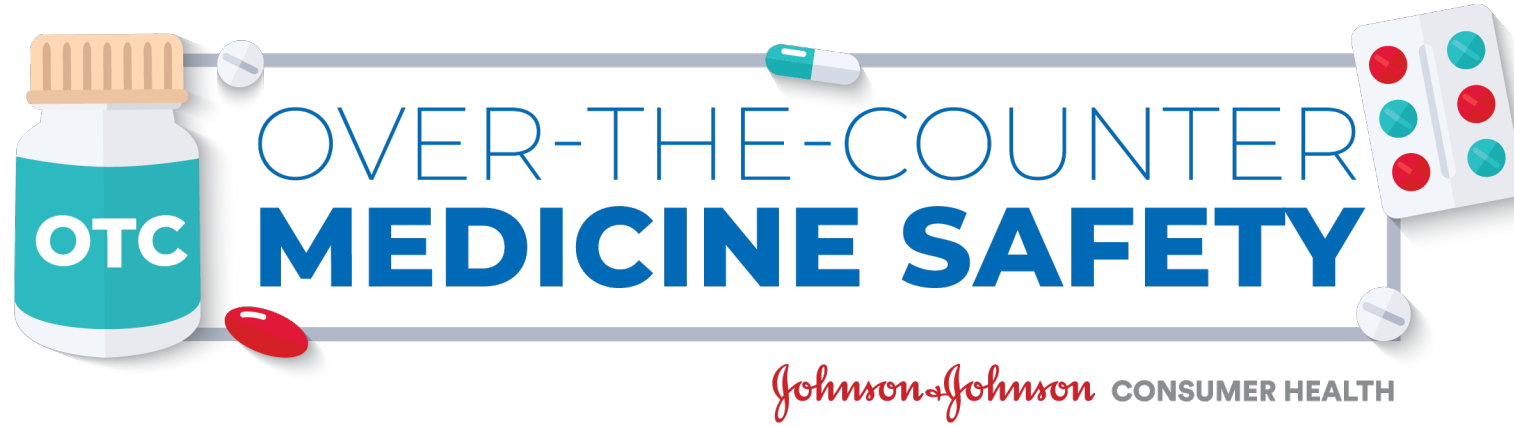

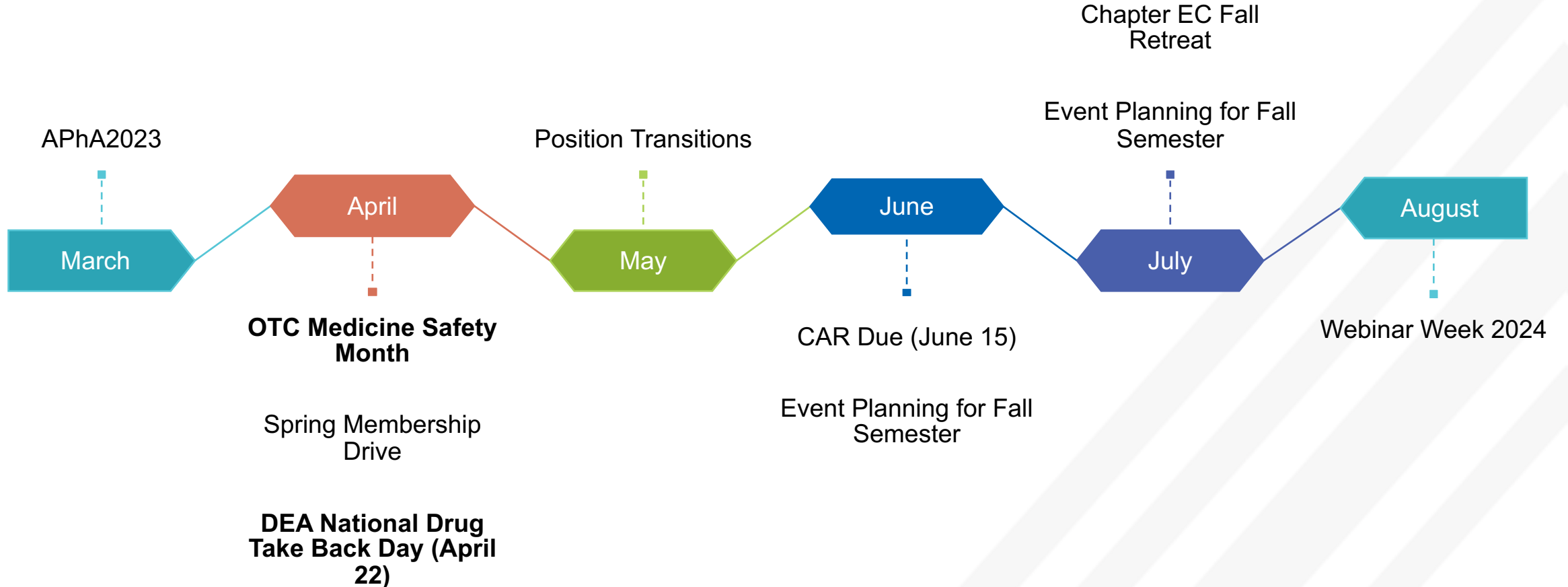

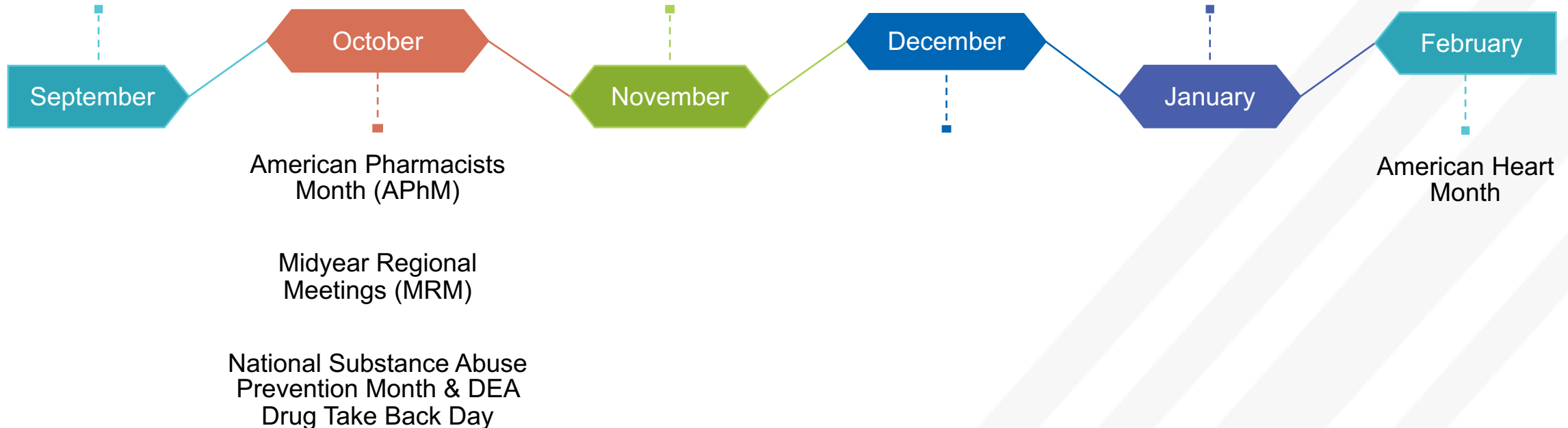

As the medication experts, who better than pharmacists and student pharmacists to serve in this vital role within communities across the U.S.

Through the [OTC Medicine Safety Campaign](#), APhA-ASP Chapters will educate 5th through 8th graders, as well as their parents and caregivers on:

- Reading medicine directions
- Following OTC label directions
- Proper measurement of medicine
- Safe storage and disposal of medicine
- Consulting with parent or guardian before taking medications



Program Results

OTC Medicine Safety was launched as an official APhA-ASP National Patient Care project in 2015. The results of the 2020-2021 OTC Medicine Safety campaign highlight the following accomplishments of APhA-ASP chapters:

- 93 chapters participated
- 5,801 student pharmacists participated
- 144 faculty and staff members participated
- 113 pharmacists participated
- 38,040 individuals educated through OTC Medicine Safety
 - 9,008 5th through 8th graders
 - 6,183 parents and caregivers
 - 5,769 coaches and educators
- 6,614,781 individuals reached through public relations initiatives
